


How likely would you be to attend an indoor In-Person GRCC meeting in September or October 2021?









If our Club meeting was held both In-Person AND the program presentation was provided via ZOOM, do you think you would attend in person, or stay home and join in via Zoom?
















All my answers depend on the status of COVID & CDC decisions. Although I'm a print maker I would not be upset if prints were eliminated.
