#### **GRCC President Letter**

# Summer is Winding Down with Changes





Summer is winding down already. How can that be? The days are getting shorter and it won't be too much longer till cooler weather sets in. It's also time for GRCC to start up again with programs and our monthly competition.

Thank you to those of you who responded to the survey that was sent out last week. It was helpful to hear from the membership. The Board met recently to review the responses, and discuss how the club should proceed.



One of our first decisions was regarding WHERE the club will meet once we do resume face-to-face gatherings. A new location option just became available with Grand Valley Artists recent move to a new space on 29th Street behind Schuler Books. The gathering space is large with high ceilings, state-of-the-art projector and screen, kitchen area for refreshments, more comfortable seating and plenty of parking. The space is all on street level. This means no elevator or stairs or a long walk to access the meeting room, or haul equipment to and from... and no need to buzz in with a security system.

Although the meeting space at Grace Episcopal Church has served us well, there were a number of factors that made it less than ideal. The Board has voted that WHEN we resume in person meetings, we will gather at Grand Valley Artists, 2661 29th Street SE, Suite B, Grand Rapids, MI 49512.

With the WHERE question answered, the WHEN was the next agenda item. The Board has decided that the September 15, 2021 meeting will be entirely by Zoom, just as our meetings have been since June 2020. This decision was made for a host of reasons, including the uncertainty of the Delta variant and Covid trajectory, the fact that Grand Valley Artists is still settling in after their August move and working out some logistics, and that our September presenter is out of state so the program will be via Zoom regardless of whether we are F2F or not. Our plan at this time is to hold our October 20, 2021 meeting face-to-face at the new

Grand Valley Artists location, assuming that the Covid situation is not out of control. Any CDC masking recommendations at the time will be adhered to. This will also give us time to work out the logistics of making this a hybrid meeting so that those who are not comfortable attending in person can attend via Zoom. That said, best laid plans do not always work out. Since the pandemic's trajectory is a moving target, the Board will revisit this decision following our September Zoom meeting. If the decision needs to be amended at any time along the way, we will do that.

Though many of us have become accustomed to viewing photography on a digital screen, for some photographers there is something special about seeing a photograph printed and matted or framed. After much discussion the Board has decided that print competition will remain on hiatus for the remainder of 2020. The uncertainty of whether we will actually be able to start and maintain F2F meetings as planned is one factor in this decision. If we cannot SHOW the print entries in person to the membership, the point of printing is lost. Viewing a print digitally defeats the purpose of a print. Printing is a costly endeavor and to encourage members to prepare prints for a competition and membership viewing which might need to be cancelled at the last minute is not fair to the member. At the November Board meeting the topic will be raised again. Our hope is that we can start 2022 with the pandemic on a more even keel, F2F meetings the norm rather than the oddity, and begin a new competition year afresh... with both PRINT and DIGITAL entries.



### Changes to Competition Guidelines

Here are the changes recently made about competition entries, as noted in the June 2021 Lights & Shadows.

- 1
- You may enter more than one Assigned Subject entry each month. You may enter 4 images in any combination among all the categories as long as at least <u>one</u> entry is in the assigned category. If you choose not to enter in the assigned category, only 3 images are allowed.
- You may re-enter a disqualified image in a proper category **as a 5th image** the following month. The VP of Competition will contact you of a disqualification (DQ). No score will be applied the month of the DQ; the score will be applied the following month when it is re-entered and judged in the correct category. If a member does not re-enter the image in the competition month immediately following the DQ, his or her score will be forfeited.
- To qualify for Photographer of the Year, the number of images needed to be entered in each category has been reduced to 5 of the 7 remaining categories (other than assigned), rather than 6.
- We hope to resume prints beginning with the new competition year in January 2022.


Steve Port's **Timed Exposure** A Bit of Photography History




## New Digital Projector Fund
