The Wait is Over – October is Face to Face

After a very long hiatus, Grand Rapids Camera Club is finally going to hold an in-person meeting! Our October 20th meeting will be face-to-face in a new meeting location. You can read all the details elsewhere in the newsletter about the speaker, his background and the topic his program will be on. I will concentrate here on the logistics end of things. Be sure to read through because there is something for everyone here, in person and by Zoom.





First off, we will be meeting at a NEW LOCATION – the home of **Grand Valley Artists**, **2661 29th Street SE**, **Suite B**, **Grand Rapids**, **MI 49512**. This is a store front space behind Schuler's Book Store. It is at street level and there are no stairs so access should not be an issue for anyone. When you enter there is a large gallery space in the front... walk through to the back where the large meeting space is. We will gather at 7:15 p.m. on October 20th.

The CDC recommendations for the current Covid risk level in Kent County are for all persons to wear a mask at indoor settings regardless of vaccination status. These are the terms on which the Board has voted to proceed with the October F2F meeting.

A properly worn mask will be required during the entire meeting. If you are unable or unwilling to wear a mask for the duration of the meeting, then you should not plan to attend in person.

HOWEVER, if you will not be attending in person, you can still attend by Zoom. We are still working out the logistics of how a hybrid meeting will happen, but the plan is to have a video camera set up in the room, hooked to a laptop running Zoom. How the sound, and the speaker's projected slides (or the competition slides) will look to someone attending by Zoom is an unknown at this time, but we plan to do some testing prior to the meeting.

Join us for a Private Wildlife Photo Shoot at

Blandford Nature Center on Saturday, October 23, 2021 from 10 a.m. - 12 noon. This custom program will give photographers a chance to get up close and personal with some of Blandford's resident wildlife - everything from turtles to birds of prey. Whenever possible, animals will be staged in areas with natural backgrounds and outdoor light. Natural perches like stumps and branches will be used with certain birds; other birds may be required to stay on an educator's glove.

We still have about 10 openings available!

Attendance is limited to 20 adults.



Photographer of the Year (and other awesome awards)

It's hard to believe the year has gone so fast. And it's time to start narrowing down your entries and thinking about year-end awards and photo competition. This is the one time of year when it is a true competition where competitors actually compete with one another for awards. There's also the coveted Photographer of the Year, and Top Scorer in Digital that will be awarded. Since we have not entered prints this year, there will not be a year-end print competition. And because of that fact, the qualifications have been amended.

Photographer of the Year

To be eligible for Photographer of the Year (POY), these conditions must be met. 1) You must have entered a minimum of 36 entries during the competition year (Jan-Dec 2021). 2) Five of those entries must be in the ASSIGNED category. 3) You must have entered images in at least 5 of the remaining 7 categories. Once those conditions are met, the POY will be the photographer with the highest average score. The average score will be determined by dividing the sum of a member's total scores by the number of entries.

Top Scorer Digital

This will be the photographer who has achieved the top of the ranking in total year-to-date scores. This will be determined by the sum of your scores rather than the average.

Year-End Photo Contest

Only images that were entered in the 2021 competition year are eligible. Because of the number of competitors and images each year, the number of entries allowed are determined by the GRCC Board in November. Last year, we allowed 5 images per category to be entered, but this could change for this year. In December, we will let you know the number of images. To be sure you have the maximum amount of entries possible, be aware of how many images you have entered in each category. Now is the time to start to narrow that down. I have records of each member's entries and can send them to you at your request.

The Grand Rapids Press could not employ me because my dad worked there, so I got into computer programming and have been doing that ever since. Rex Larson ended up getting the GRP position I wanted, and he worked there for over 35 years.

What made you decide to join GRCC and when?

I joined in January 2017. I wanted to meet others photographers and join in their photographic adventures.

What kind of photography do you like to do?

I like to shoot anything that catches the eye. Since joining the club, I have enjoyed the assignment challenges that are out there.




As a photographer, what advice can you give others in the club to help them with their photography?

I am doing that right now. I got involved with the board and became a director to help out in the club.






September Image of the Month

A Bit of Photography History



Your Vision and Determination Helps You Chase the Elusive "Perfect" Picture

I began taking pictures in about 1968 after buying a cheapo Agfa camera from a drugstore near my college campus. Probably never took more than two rolls of film with that device. Film and processing were more than I could afford so I took a time out for a while. Maybe 10 years following college I bought my first Nikon film camera. I shot slides because they were cheaper to process than film. A year or so later I added a Nikkormat so that I could have two bodies with different lenses. I then added a Nikonos so that I could shoot in foul weather or under water. I was good for maybe 20 years with all that, but digital loomed on the horizon.



I bought myself a fancy new digital camera sometime in 2002. If memory serves, it was a Sony MVC-FD200. MVC stood for Mavica (magnetic video camera). FD stood for floppy disc (3.5") and 200 stood for 2 megapixel. It had a 10X zoom lens. Sony has always been willing to do something new when it comes to gear of any kind. Can you believe it? So proud!

The Mavica handled pretty well even if it was shaped so much different than my old Nikon 35mm film cameras. It had the form factor of a hard back novel. It was very convenient to download and (eventually) edit photos on my home computer. I carried a pocket full of floppies out on a shoot. Other photographers looked at me strangely when I popped a floppy from what did or did not look like a camera. I think each floppy could record 10 or 12 shots.

I added a little Fujifilm pocketable digital camera next to aid in portability but it only shot 1 megapixel files. Eventually I got a Canon PowerShot with a decent built in zoom. The Canon could do most anything I needed but we were just entering the megapixel arms race, so it soon seemed like it had too small file sizes to mess with. By then I was into Adobe Photoshop Elements, so post processing was the new big thing.

Soon I made the big move into DSLR territory with a series of Canon cameras. First a 20D followed by a 40D and then a 7D and now a 7D MK II (my current unit). Adobe PS and LR were the software choices of the day. The evolution of software is a whole different story on its own.

So why should anyone care about my personal Photographic History? If you are anything like me, you realize that there is no clear destination for this trip. It's more about your own personal journey chasing the elusive "perfect" picture. The old adage that "If I just had a camera like that, I could capture wonderful shots" is just as phony now as when it was first said. It is your vision and determination that fuels the trip, not just the gear. Cameras come and cameras go, but that fire that makes you want to click away is really what it's all about. Shoot on GRCC!




New Digital Projector Fund
