- 10. Help behind the scenes on competition






Three Key Positions Open

52-Frames Photo Challenge





CHANGES BEGINNING THIS MONTH

Print Competitions For 2023

- **1.** Print competitions will be held 4 times a year (March, May, October and December).
- 2. Entering an Assigned subject will no longer be required for prints (It will still be a requirement when entering your digital entries).
- 3. You may enter up to 6 prints in any combination in any category. This includes Assigned if you wish (remember Assigned is no longer required for prints).
- Viewing distances when judging prints will be changed to 5 foot for images 12 inches (long dimension) or less, and 7 foot for those images larger than the 12" maximum for small prints. Previously they were viewed at 6 foot and 9 foot. These are image sizes not the mount size.
- 5. Prints must be mounted on a rigid background such as heavy matboard or foam core. Prints mounted on paper or posterboard will not be accepted.
- The minimum size for the mounting shall be no less than 10 inches on the longest side. The maximum size of mounting shall be no more than 20 inches on the longest side. Prints can be any size as long as they are within the mount sizes mentioned here.

Photographer of the Year For the 2023 Competition Year

- Beginning with the new competition year (2023) a competitor will be required to enter a minimum of 36 images in any combination prints and/or digital to be eligible for Photographer of the Year (This is a change from 40 required previously). Entry of a minimum of 5 assigned images and entry of images in a minimum of 5 of the 7 remaining categories will continue to be a requirement as it is now.
- A trophy will be awarded to the Photographer of the Year determined by calculating the highest average score across both divisions. A ribbon will be awarded to the top scoring photographer in digital and in prints.



WHY I LIKED IT:

What a great Photojournalism (PJ) image! The motion of the Fire Dancer and his twirling fireballs is shown with the blur of the chains and the trailing fire track as well as the dancers hair. I love the reflection of the fire in his protective goggles just visible between his dreadlocks! Catching the motion of the performer creates strong PJ image – but the look of awe on the boy observing from the background is the icing on the cake. The sweep of the fire draws you from the performer to his mesmerized audience! Great depth of field and a rare, uncluttered PJ background all add up to a winning PJ image! Well done!


