Cost: \$40 RSVP by April 19, 2023 to info@grcameraclub.org Limited to 25 participants We will have the opportunity to photograph a total of 8 different raptors. These birds are ambassador birds for the Nature Center, so they will be tethered. There will be two perch stations, and 2 birds will be out simultaneously for approximately 30 minutes. Participants will be able to easily move between the two perch station areas to get photos of both birds.

Expected species:

Coopers Hawk, Red Shouldered Hawk, Peregrine Falcon, American Kestral, Eastern Screech Owl, Barn Owl, Snowy Owl, and Golden Eagle.

Species are subject to change at the discretion of the ODC staff.

The Ins and Outs of Photojournalism





What:

Photojournalism is journalism that uses photographs to tell a story. Photojournalists capture images of events, people, and places to help convey news in a engaging and compelling way.

Photojournalism is an important part of news and also sports reporting because it allows viewers and readers to see what is actually happening and to emotionally connect with the story.



For news, photojournalists are often sent to cover crimes, political protests or natural disasters. And for sporting events, they want to capture the excitement, intensity and memorable moments of the game. Photography helps to do that.

Presence: The Photography Collection of Judy Glickman Lauder

February 11- April 29, 2023

This exhibit features 145 photographs by 70 artists from the collection of Judy Glickman Lauder, a photographer, collector and humanitarian. Through Glickman Lauder's selection of artists, Presence creates a dialogue between some of the most beloved and influential photographers of the 20th century, including Berenice Abbott, Diane Arbus, Richard Avedon, Margaret Bourke-White, Danny Lyon, Sally Mann, Gordon Parks, and James Van Der Zee. The exhibition also includes photographs by critical contributors to the medium's history, such as Irving Bennett Ellis, Graciela Iturbide, Lotte Jacobi, and Alma Lavenson.

Organized by the Portland Museum of Art (Maine), the Presence collection is inextricably shaped by her personal and artistic vision. As the daughter of a photographer and a master photographic activist and storyteller in her own right, Glickman Lauder developed her collection over several decades, resulting in an intimate, lifelong connection to the medium. As an artist, Glickman Lauder's photographs have been exhibited worldwide and are represented in over 300 public and private collections, including the J. Paul Getty Museum, the Whitney Museum of American Art, the Metropolitan Museum of Art, and the United States Holocaust Museum.






